Have a great day out in Esk Valley. Take the train and visit one of the picturesque villages along the route or visit Stewart Park for a great family day out.

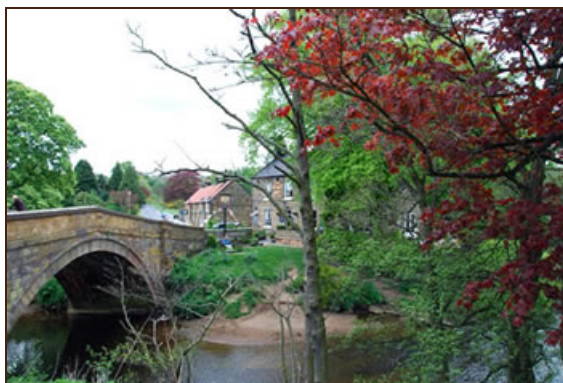


Day out at Stewart Park on a Sunday :

Stewart Park covers 120 acres and is only 5 minutes walk from Marton Station. The park consists of mature woodland and an arboretum as well as open parkland. There is an extensive pet's corner, play area, outdoor table tennis, mini golf, café and lots more to do and see. Stewart Park also houses the Captain Cook Birthplace Museum.

From Whitby: 1025 from Whitby, arriving 1158 Marton. Return on the 1629 from Marton, arriving 1755 at Whitby.

Day out to Lealholm on a Sunday:

Explore the village and surrounding countryside, including the obligatory trip over the Stepping Stones. Visit Poets Corner nursery, Stepping Stones Bakery and relaxing by the river at the Board Inn for a pint and lunch or have lunch at Shepherds Hall Tearooms.

From Whitby: 1025 arriving at 1057. Depart at 1414 from Lealholm, arriving at Whitby 1515

From Middlesbrough: 1107 from Middlesbrough arriving at Lealholm at 1201. Return on the 1557 arriving back at Middlesbrough 1653.
